1. Archaeological open-air museums

This refers to museums with reconstructed houses or tents that are based on archaeology. A famous US example is Colonial Williamsburg, but forts with reconstructions or Native American reconstructed dwellings are part of this as well;

2. Experimental archaeology

This does not simply cover only academic work, but includes any serious attempt to understand the past through experimentation using archaeological sources;

3. Prehistoric and historic technologies

This includes mastering the various skills and industries of the past from stone tool production to blacksmithing. The Society of Primitive Technology has focused on much of this in the United States;

4. (Museum) interpretation

This includes living history, museum education and any kind of interpreting the past.
