Guests of the international conference held at the Civic Archaeological Museum this morning visited the ancient Roman road rediscovery and Saturday 14th will be in Montale

The participants at the OpenArch European meeting in progress at the Archeological Museum of Modena were able to preview the Roman road brought to the light at Novi Ark. This morning, under the guide of director Ilaria Pulini, they gathered in the yard over the parking lot, where he is working to build the archaeological park and museum dedicated to *Mutina*, whose inauguration is scheduled for July.

The participants, welcomed Thursday by the Mayor of Modena Giorgio Pighi, are all experts in reconstructions of archaeological contexts of different eras, from Prehistory to the Middle Ages, and are sent by museum organizations across Europe (Spain, England, Germany, Sweden, Netherlands, Serbia and Finland) to participate in the OpenArch European project together with the Italian Terramara Archaeological Park of Montale.

Fulcrum of the conference in Modena, is the workshops on metallurgy in the Bronze Age "Smiths in Bronze Age Europe" with internationally renowned experts and an interactive approach. Tomorrow, Saturday April 14th, the delegation will move to Montale for further work, which will conclude on Sunday 15th with a public event about bronze casting that will be combined with a workshop for children on the melting chocolate.
